Notes & Recommendations from Towson University:

- Core 1 at TU is automatically waived for all transfer students.
- Course equivalents ending in TLL are general lower-level elective coursework at TU.
- Students must follow the course selections outlined in this agreement. Failing to complete the specified courses will require them to fulfill remaining requirements at TU and could jeopardize their ability to earn a bachelor's degree within two years. Courses with the ♦ symbol are recommendations only; consult with advising for alternate options to complete all coursework within four years.
- No more than three "Topics" courses (CRMJ 370/375) can be completed at TU for credit in the CRMJ concentration. Adviser consent required for approval in designated area. Topic of course must be related to designated area in order for course to count.
- Up to 18 units can be completed in transfer and applied toward the concentration with the approval of a departmental adviser.

Bachelor's degree requirements for all students:

- A cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 is required.
- A C grade (2.0 GPA) or higher is required for all major courses and prerequisites.
- 32 credits of the bachelor's degree must be completed at the upper level (courses numbered 300 or above) at TU
