INSTITUTIONAL ARTICULATED PATHWAY AGREEMENT

Montgomery College (MC), a community college in Montgomery County, Maryland, and the University of Baltimore (UB), a four-year school in Baltimore, Maryland, and a member of the University System of Maryland, agree to the following pathway that will lead to the award of a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration at the University of Baltimore.

PURPOSE OF AGREEMENT

This agreement is entered into in the interests of our students. The general purpose of this agreement is to make clear the terms of this institutional articulated pathway. It will set expectations for administrators, faculty and staff at both institutions, and foster a working relationship between the parties. Finally, it will encourage students to continue their education for their own personal and professional development.

ADMINISTRATIVE PRINCIPLES

The following general principles guide the operation of this agreement:

1. The pathway is designed for graduates of the A.A. in Business at MC. A maximum of 63 credit hours from MC will be allowed towards fulfillment of the 120 credit hours required for baccalaureate completion at UB.
2. The maximum number of credits that will be accepted by UB toward degree requirements from non-direct classroom instruction (including CLEP, AP, other nationally recognized standardized examination scores and other postsecondary institutions) is 30 credits. If the credit is not on the MC transcript, the student may submit the score report to be evaluated by UB and credit will be applied as determined by UB's evaluation. Credit awarded for experiential learning ("life experience") if awarded by MC is generally recognized by, and is transferable to, UB. At least 25 percent of credit coursework must be earned at MC. At least 30 credits must be earned at UB to be eligible for graduation; no more than 30 credits can be earned via credit by exam, nationally-recognized exams, or portfolio.
3. UB will determine the applicability of course work taken at other postsecondary institutions.
4. This agreement is for the purposes of transfer credit only, and does not address nor guarantee any expectations of institutional or degree admissions requirements, financial aid and scholarship eligibility, unless otherwise noted.
5. This agreement becomes effective on November 15, 2020. This agreement will remain in effect for an initial term of five years and may be extended for additional terms per mutual written agreement of the parties. Six months' written notice must be provided should either party wish to terminate the agreement prior to its expiration. In the case of termination of this agreement, the institutions will work together to provide information for students currently using the pathway.
6. Both institutions agree to notify the other, in writing, of curriculum changes within sixty days of the change. Changes to curriculum can be made without completing the signatory process.
7. The office of record for institutional partnership agreements at UB is the Office of the Executive Vice President and Provost. The office of record for institutional partnership agreements at Montgomery College is the Office of the Senior Vice President for Academic Affairs.

8. The parties will comply with all provisions of the federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) in all disclosures of FERPA protected information between MC and UB. For example, the parties may be able to share personally identifiable information from a student's record for purposes related to a student's enrollment or transfer, per 34 C.F.R §§ 99.31 (a)(2) and 99.34. Also consistent with FERPA, the parties shall use reasonable methods to ensure that they provide only those education records that are necessary in the administration of this agreement. Under this agreement, the use of data shared is for no purpose other than this initiative. Nothing in this Agreement may be construed to allow the parties to maintain, use, disclose, or share student record information in a manner not allowed under Federal law or regulation.
9. The parties designate the following individuals to serve as administrators under this agreement:

MC Program Administrator: Justin Edgar, Articulation and Transfer Program Manager

UB Program Administrator: Seth Kamen, Assistant Vice President, Office of Admission
10. This agreement represents the entire and integrated agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations or agreements, either written or oral. This agreement may be amended only by written instrument signed by both parties.
11. The failure of either party to insist, in any one or more instances, on the performance of any of the terms, covenants, or conditions of this agreement, or to exercise any of its rights, shall not be construed as a waiver or relinquishment of such term, covenant, condition or right with respect to further performance.
12. Each provision of this agreement shall be deemed to be a separate, severable and independently enforceable provision. The invalidity or breach of any provisions shall not cause the invalidity or breach of the remaining provisions hereof.
13. This agreement may be executed in counterparts and each counterpart shall be deemed an original.
14. This agreement shall be governed in accordance with the laws of the State of Maryland. Any legal proceedings brought pursuant to this agreement shall be brought only in the state courts of Maryland.
15. MC and UB, in accordance with all applicable laws, do not discriminate against any person on the basis of age, color, national origin, race, religion, mental or physical disability, sex, gender identity, veterans' status, sexual orientation, or any other basis protected by applicable law.
16. Nothing contained in this agreement shall be deemed or construed by the parties hereto, or by any third party, as creating a relationship between MC and UB as principal and agent and/or employer and employee.

3. UB will determine the applicability of course work taken at other postsecondary institutions.
4. This agreement is for the purposes of transfer credit only, and does not address nor guarantee any expectations of institutional or degree admissions requirements, financial aid and scholarship eligibility, unless otherwise noted.
5. This agreement becomes effective on November 15, 2020. This agreement will remain in effect for an initial term of five years and may be extended for additional terms per mutual written agreement of the parties. Six months' written notice must be provided should either party wish to terminate the agreement prior to its expiration. In the case of termination of this agreement, the institutions will work together to provide information for students currently using the pathway.
6. Both institutions agree to notify the other, in writing, of curriculum changes within sixty days of the change. Changes to curriculum can be made without completing the signatory process.
7. The office of record for institutional partnership agreements at UB is the Office of the Executive Vice President and Provost. The office of record for institutional partnership agreements at Montgomery College is the Office of the Senior Vice President for Academic Affairs.

8. The parties will comply with all provisions of the federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) in all disclosures of FERPA protected information between MC and UB. For example, the parties may be able to share personally identifiable information from a student's record for purposes related to a student's enrollment or transfer, per 34 C.F.R §§ 99.31 (a)(2) and 99.34. Also consistent with FERPA, the parties shall use reasonable methods to ensure that they provide only those education records that are necessary in the administration of this agreement. Under this agreement, the use of data shared is for no purpose other than this initiative. Nothing in this Agreement may be construed to allow the parties to maintain, use, disclose, or share student record information in a manner not allowed under Federal law or regulation.

The failure of either party to insist, in any one or more instances, on the performance of any of the terms, covenants, or conditions of this agreement, or to exercise any of its rights, shall not be construed as a waiver or relinquishment of such term, covenant, condition or right with respect to further performance.
12. Each provision of this agreement shall be deemed to be a separate, severable and independently enforceable provision. The invalidity or breach of any provisions shall not cause the invalidity or breach of the remaining provisions hereof.
13. This agreement may be executed in counterparts and each counterpart shall be deemed an original.
14. This agreement shall be governed in accordance with the laws of the State of Maryland. Any legal proceedings brought pursuant to this agreement shall be brought only in the state courts of Maryland.
