ESOL Classes: Spring (II) 2025

The Adult ESOL Program provides basic English language and life skills instruction to Maryland residents whose native language is not English. Students must be at least 18 years old. Students with F1 or J1 visas cannot take classes in this program. All classes are free except for Advanced ESOL (\$100 fee).

- 2. All students must apply in person at the time and location where they want to take a class; on the date and time listed below
- 3. New students return to the site where they applied, for a placement test.
